## Pastoral Reflections

**Scripture Reflection (Holy Family Year B December 26<sup>th</sup>, 2021).** This collection of spiritual lessons was originally composed in Hebrew by a certain Jesus ben Sirach, who, according to tradition, was a teacher in Jerusalem in the early decades of the second century BC. Years later a grandson took on the daunting task of translating this book into Greek so that his grandfather's insights would benefit Jews outside the Holy Land, those seeking practical advice about how to live according to the law of Moses.

Today's Gospel is the only story depicting Jesus as an adolescent in the four Gospels. It serves two purposes. Theologically, Jesus testifies to his divine sonship by referring to God as his Father, the first time in the Gospel that Jesus makes this claim. Secondly, it offers a glimpse into family life as experienced by Mary, Joseph, and Jesus. This helps ground the theological claims of Jesus within the context of real human living. Jesus always was both fully human and fully divine.

**The twelve-year-old Jesus is lost.** The setting of this story is very realistic. Family members (both local plus extended) have just celebrated the Passover in a very crowded Jerusalem. On the way home, they realize that Jesus is missing. He has remained behind in Jerusalem without his parents' knowledge. No doubt it was presumed that he was somewhere among the extended fami-

ly members. Only a day later do they discover that he has, in fact, vanished.

**The lost Jesus is found in the Jerusalem temple.** The search for the lost Jesus went on for three days in a still very crowded Jerusalem. The level of panic on the part of the family can only be imagined. No details are given, but somehow the lost Jesus is found in the Jerusalem temple, situated in the midst of teachers listening to them and questioning them. This, of course, would be amazing, but that is not the emotion expressed by Mary and Joseph. They are astonished that this 12-year-old would put his parents through such an ordeal.

**Who is this adolescent child?** Once the relief of finding the child subsides, his mother lets him know in no uncertain terms how irresponsible he has been. Jesus responds on a different level, offering a theological answer to a domestic family situation. Why were his parents concerned? Do they not know who he is and what he must be about? The answer is definitely no. Jesus is the Son of God, and obedience to his Father supersedes obedience to his parents. On a human level, however, his parents win the day. Jesus finds himself back with his family, headed for Nazareth. There he will continue to grow into adulthood, acquiring wisdom and knowledge before God and humans.

### Saint Stephen ~d. c. 36~Feast Day: Dec. 26th



"As discipleship grew, the Greek-speaking Christians complained against the Hebrew-speaking Christians, saying that their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. The Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, 'It is not right for us to neglect the word of God and serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, and we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word.' They chose Stephen, a man filled with faith and the Holy Spirit."

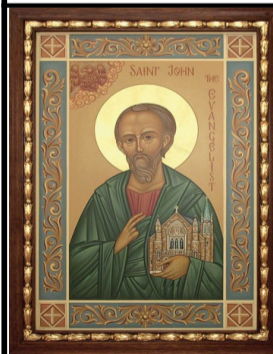
He was a man filled with grace and power, who worked great wonders. Certain Jews debated with Stephen, but proved no match in how he spoke. They persuaded others to make the charge of blasphemy against him. Seized and carried before the Sanhedrin, Stephen recalled God's guidance through Israel's history, as well as Israel's idolatry and disobedience claiming that his persecutors were showing this same spirit just as their ancestors" The crowd was angered, "But he, filled with the holy Spirit, looked up intently to heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God, and said, 'Behold, I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God.' As he was being stoned, Stephen cried out, 'Lord Jesus, receive.' ...'Lord, do not hold this sin against them.'"
