

Pastoral Reflections

Scripture Reflection (17th, Sun in Ord. Year C)

Abraham still struggles to trust in the words God has spoken to him. On the other hand, God has enough confidence in Abraham to share with him the fact that he is proceeding toward Sodom and Gomorrah (18:17-19). The reason for the journey is to confirm reports about the sinfulness of those two cities. This detail reveals God's mercy and forbearance, divine characteristics in which Abraham still struggles to place his trust. Today's Gospel focuses on the Lord's Prayer, along with two stories intended to encourage people to persevere in their prayer and not become discouraged. Luke cannot presuppose his community knows much about prayer, for many of them are gentiles. Thus, he must keep them encouraged by providing useful instruction. Today's Gospel exemplifies that instruction. Luke's version of the Lord's Prayer is shorter than Matthew's but is probably closer to the original.

Teach us to pray. Jesus teaches his disciples the Lord's Prayer as a response to their request to have a specific prayer form as did the disciples of John the Baptist. Apparently, different groups had particular ways of praying, and this added to their identity. Jesus makes his prayer very short, consisting of only a few petitions: Your kingdom come; give us daily bread; forgive us our sins as

we forgive others; and do not subject us to the final test. **Demands rather than requests**. All these petitions are found in Jewish prayers. However, in almost every case the petition is expressed in the future tense. These are things people want to take place at the end of time when the world finally comes to a conclusion. In the Lord's Prayer, however, all the petitions are expressed as imperatives (in Greek, aorist imperative). In other words, these petitions become demands on the lips of Jesus, who encourages people to be bold in prayer and not be afraid to make demands on God. Just as Jesus prayed to God, so the followers of Jesus must do. They, too, share the intimate relationship with God ex[1]pressed here as Father. **Be bold and persevering in prayer.** Luke adds two vi-

gnettes to his version of the Lord's Prayer. The first is a humorous story about a person who needs bread for guests in the middle of the night. The conclusion? If you keep banging on the door, eventually it will be answered. The teaching is to be equally persistent in your prayer. The second story makes the same emphasis. Keep knocking, and eventually the door will be opened. We can always be assured that God will give us good things when we ask. Persevering in prayer requires that a person must practice it.

Saints Martha, May and Lazarus ~c. 1st century~



Martha, Mary, and their brother Lazarus were evidently close friends of Jesus. He came to their home simply as a welcomed guest. The sisters felt free to call on Jesus at their brother's death. Martha's great glory is her simple and strong statement of faith in Jesus after her brother's death. "Jesus told her, 'I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die.

Do you believe this?' She said to him, 'Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world" (John 11:25-27). Martha prepares a meal for Jesus and states the obvious: All hands should pitch in to help with the dinner. Mary, who has spent the preparation time at Jesus' feet listening to his words "has chosen the better part." John 12:1-8 describes Mary's anointing of Jesus' feet at Bethany, an act which he praised highly. We are told that the chief priests plotted to kill Lazarus "because many of the Jews were turning away and believing in Jesus because of him." Lazarus was the one of whom the Jews said, "See how much he loved him." In their sight Jesus raised his friend Lazarus from the dead. Legends has it that Lazarus supposedly left a written account of what he saw in the next world before he was called back to life. One such story is that despite being put into a leaking boat by the Jews at Jaffa, he, his sisters, and others landed safely in Cyprus. There he died peacefully after serving as bishop for 30 years. It is certain there was early devotion to the saint. A procession took place on the Saturday before Palm Sunday at the tomb where Lazarus had been raised from the dead. This feast day is celebrated on July 29th.



As you consider your contributions for the new fiscal year please take some time to consider your household tithe to the parish which will in turn tithe 10% to the diocese each month.
